Optional: Presentation (non-beekeeper), one-on-one instruction, work fair or booth, assist youth group (4H, FFA ...), write article to publish, present or write history of beekeeping, host field day or instruction in apiary

Teaching or presenting material helps people learn material better but can be a bit intimidating for some. Use the tip paper listed below. This should be a fun experience for you and who you are working with. Dig into your research on topic and designing material you wish to use. This is your real growth area.

Team teaching is fun but harder to coordinate. Work with more advanced or beekeepers with a different thought process. It will make a better, more balanced product.
